

CELEBRATION OF CITIES 2 ON DISPLAY IN VENICE

On 8 September, an exhibition of the forty projects selected for the international short-list during the UIA consultation **Celebration of Cities 2 - an idea for the city**, will open its doors in Venice; the exhibition will run until 10 November 2006, at Palazzo Zorzi, UNESCO's regional headquarters.

The exhibition's opening will take place on 8 September, in presence of the authors of the three projects awarded grand-prizes during this consultation. A conference will be animated by **Odile Decq**, **Massimo Gallione**, **Jaime Lerner**, **Josep Llop Torné**, and **Wolf Tochtermann**. **Rafaele Sirica**, president of the Italian National Council of Architects, Town Planners, Landscape Architects, and Conservationists (CNAPPC), will close the day-long event..

For the first time, the UIA will be part of the **Venice Biennale of Architecture**, the tenth edition of which will take place from 10 September to 19 November around two distinct yet complementary exhibitions **Cities: architecture and society** and **Cities of Stone**.

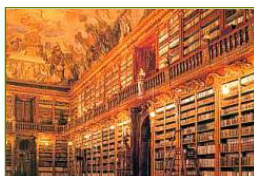

ASMARA, AFRICA'S SECRET MODERNIST CITY

From 3 October to 3 December 2006, the German Center for Architecture in Berlin (DAZ) will host the first presentation of an exhibition dedicated to Asmara. Built almost entirely during the Italian occupation in the 1920s and 1930s, the city centre in the capital of the African state of Eritrea, which borders the Red Sea, is a little-known jewel of Modern Movement architecture. Most of the edifices within the city center are creations of Italian Modernist schools such as *architettura razionale*, *novecento*, or *futurismo*.

The UIA, along with Unesco and other prestigious organisations, lends its support to this cultural initiative realised by the **Asmara Project Group**. The curators of the project are **Naigzy Gebremedhin** and **Omar Akbar**. This traveling exhibition will be presented at the **Turin 2008 UIA World Congress**, and following its appearance in several cities around the world, it will be permanently installed in Asmara.

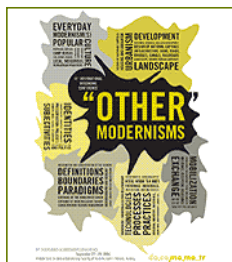

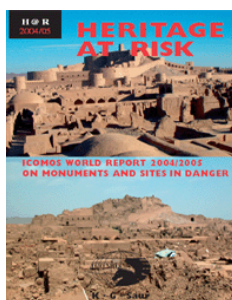
"OTHER" MODERNISMS
