## 2. 20th CENTURY: Changes During and After Vietnam Wars

- 1945: The monarchy ended, and the Imperial City of Hue was altered to serve the new regime - 1968: During the Tet Offensive of the Mậu Thân year, many areas within the Imperial City were heavily damaged, with many historical buildings destroyed or disappeared by bombs

### 3. Post-1975: Urbanization and Conservation


- 1993: The Hue Imperial City was officially recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site after a long preservation period. The Hue Imperial City has become isolated due to rapid urbanization, with a lack of connection between heritage, the community, and the surrounding landscape.


The system of canals and ponds for water regulation in the original plan has disappeared due to urbanization, causing the Hue Imperial City to frequently face flooding


# 5. Present Day: Tourism boom


The tourism boom puts pressure on urban infrastructure and heritage conservation. Heritage is being commercialized and losing its spiritual and cultural value




